What is Woolly Wednesday?

Woolly Wednesday is an awareness day that promotes the support available from NewstrAid for those struggling to cover the cost of heating over the winter.

When does it take place?

In 2024 Woolly Wednesday will take place on **Wednesday 30th October**. This coincides with the distribution of NewstrAid's Winter Comfort grant which provides around 400 of the charity's beneficiaries with a small financial boost to help them stay warm during the colder months.

How will it help?

NewstrAid receives applications for help from hundreds of people every year. Woolly Wednesday aims to help spread the word so that as many people as possible from the newstrade who are struggling to make ends meet know about the support available. It will also help to raise funds for the charity through a winter raffle.
